One safeguarding area that came up last year was online safety. We enjoyed police visits for children and parents and a few people said that they would like more information, so we have subscribed to a monthly online safety newsletter. The September edition is provided with this newsletter.

Attendance

Attendance is part of our safeguarding work and you may have seen in the news that it is also a big government priority for this year. Once your child is of school age (the term after they turn five), it is essential that unless your child is genuinely too ill to attend, or there are extreme extenuating circumstances, they are in school every single day. For children below school age, we want to encourage good attendance habits right from the start and ask you to ensure that your child attends on all the days that they are registered.

Professor Christ Whitty, the Chief Medical Officer, has written to schools about illness and school attendance and says that it is usually appropriate for pupils to attend school with mild respiratory illnesses, including general cold symptoms. Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete (RAAC)

As you all will be aware there has been a lot of news coverage of the topic of RAAC (Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete). North Yorkshire Council has been carrying out surveys and investigation into this area in line with the DfE guidance and methodology and there is no RAAC at Goathland School.

Base One have settled in well, we have been establishing classroom rules for the new term and getting to know each other by working in small groups.

Our topic this term is Chocolate! I am sure the children will enjoy this. We have already started reading some 'Chocolate' books which the children have enjoyed.







In EYFS our topic is 'All about me.' Our youngest children have been talking about things they like based on the 'You Choose Book' this week. They have worked really hard when collating their thoughts and mark making.

In Maths we have made a good start to place value in KS1. In Nursery we have been practising number rhymes and showing different numbers on our fingers. In Reception our children have been gaining a secure understanding of place value within 10.

Cardigans and jumpers - Please can everyone check that you have your child's cardigans and jumpers, we are already missing one cardigan. Please make sure ALL new uniform is labelled clearly.

Water bottles - must only contain water.

Toys - Please leave all toys at home. We have plenty at school.
