Contribution to staffing to enable participation in inter-school sports and extra-curricular provision - £3235.50	Due to our mixed age classes we need to ensure we have adequate staffing cover to allow staff to accompany children to take part in off-site/extra-curricular activities whilst still retaining appropriate staff on site for non-participating year groups.	A range of sports were experienced by a range of year groups across the school. Children gained experience of team games and competitive participation as staff were able to be released to accompany for safeguarding. Remaining year groups were able to remain in school with a teacher.
