Feeding the 5000 Holy Week – 7 days before Easter. Can identify some events from Holy Week: -Entry of Jesus into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday -The last supper -Betrayal -Arrest and trial of Jesus -The crucifixion -The Resurrection -Good Friday	Believing Why do some people think God exists? Children should be able to name some religions: -Christianity -Islam -Judaism -Hinduism -Buddhism -Sikhism Christians see God as the creator of the natural world. Able to give example of ways God is valuable in the lives of Christians, and ways in which it can be challenging.	What do religions say to us when life gets hard? Children should be able to describe the idea of a soul and what people think happens to it when we die. Can describe reincarnation and karma Define the word 'judgement' Christians and Muslims believe God judges them according to the decisions made in life. Christians — can repent and be forgiven and enter heaven. Muslim-believe there are good and bad angels who write the good and bad deeds you commit during your life. More good lead to heaven, more bad lead to hell. Allah decides.
