When a stable staffing structure is in place, ensure that all staff are confident and trained to deliver a wide range of PE, sport activity and outdoor learning opportunities for children of all ages. Enhance opportunities for children to be active at different points in the school day.	Investment in playground equipment/activities and schemes which allow for better access to being active and opportunities that would not otherwise have been possible.
Enter a greater range of competitive sporting events, especially in Key Stage 1.	Access to Whitby Sports Association. Ensure transport fund is available to allow for safe carriage to events.
Ensure children are water confident at all ages, given the school's proximity to the coast and other bodies of water.	Ensure transport is available to allow whole school to access sessions.

100% of Year 4-6 are water confident and able to swim 25 meters or more. An increased number of children in younger year groups are also capable of this.	Measure at end of swimming unit in spring term.
